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- KidsPeace announced today that it has received a \$50,000 grant from the Stephen & Tabitha King Foundation to establish a new library facility on its Graham Lake Residential Campus in Ellsworth, ME.

The award was the result of a grant application. It will provide materials and equipment for the School.

KidsPeace serves more than 100 children a year in Maine through residential and outpatient programs at Graham Lake and educational programs in Greenbush and East Millinocket. The programs include special education, day treatment for ASD youth, residential therapeutic care, clinical services, occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech pathology, nursing, psychiatric treatment, physiological care, behavioral health and case management.

KidsPeace notes that access to high-quality library materials and media collections - including print, hardware and software, online databases, production equipment and adaptive resources - help enhance the educational experience for students with special needs and develop a love for learning. With the King Foundation grant, the organization will develop a library that will foster learning activities and give students the ability to select, retrieve, analyze, evaluate, create and communicate literary information in all formats and in all content areas of the curriculum.

The library will be established in an existing classroom facility at the Graham Lake Campus.
